The 12th of September was a day of celebration for all connected to the Community Centre and it was good to see so many people taking part.



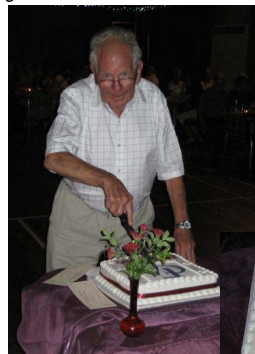
This plaque was presented during the afternoon and will be hung in the foyer.
